## Message from the Scribe

The Oxford Dictionary defines excellence as bringing four good wins in one weekend back to the club. What a fantastic achievement this is not only for the players but for the culture of the Nunawading Cricket Club. The Scribe has been banging on about this for quite a while in his fortnightly rant and whilst pondering how good this would feel and continually talking about himself in the third person, the Scribe can honestly say what a great feeling it was to play a small part in this. Yes, the Scribe was there (or thereabouts) in his anonymous disguise to soak up the atmosphere and revel in what was a wonderful experience however I do not feel that this is in any way at all a signal to rest on our laurels.

We, at Nunawading this season have new blood and perhaps it is these guys that can now set the standard, raise the standard and help build a new era of sustained success eventually culminating in a return to McIntosh Shield and rightfully assuming our position as the standard bearer of the association.

Vince Lombardi was an American NFL football coach. He is a legendary football figure, best known as the head coach of the Green Bay Packers during the 1960s. The Super Bowl trophy is named in his honor. Lombardi took over the head coaching role at the Green Bay Packers at the end of 1958 NFL season. At the time Green Bay was an average to under-performing team. In 1958 they lost all but two games.

Lombardi went on to accomplish a 106 wins–34 losses–6 ties record as head coach and he never suffered a losing season. He led the Packers to three consecutive NFL championships in 1965, 1966, and 1967, a feat accomplished **only once before in the NFL's history. Lombardi's** Green Bay Packers teams also won the first two Super Bowls, solidifying his place in history as one of, if not the greatest coach in American football history.

Lombardi is known for his many great quotes and one of them is pertinent right now: Winning is not a some-time thing; it's an all time thing. You don't win once in a while, you don't do things right once in a while, you do them right all the time. Winning is habit.

If we, as a club, can adopt the Lombardi philosophy and absorb it into our club culture, who knows what lies ahead for our great club and how we as individuals can contribute to this starts with you and starts now.


